However, role of Indian continental lithospheric components and sources in the geodynamic evolution of Himalayan collision orogen through time and their link to global thermal events is still a major research gap. In the proposed project investigation of selected transect corridors in Kumaun Lesser Himalaya will be carried out using multi-parametric approach such as phase petrology, geochemical, geochronologic and isotope studies of granites and their enclaves, which can address the petrogenetic and geodynamic issues of Himalaya and its likely relationships with equivalent orogenic belts globally. Integration of generated database will help constructing the sequence of magmatic events and crustal growth processes in space and time.
