### Introduction

The department of Home Science, D.S.B. Campus, Kumaun University, Nainital organized a one-day National Seminar on "Assisting Women in Identifying Abusive Relationships and Awareness Generation among them on Provisions for Protection against Domestic Violence" on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2022 (Tuesday) at Conference Hall, Rajya Atithi Grah, Mallital, Nainital, Uttarakhand (Nainital Club). Women should have participation in decision making. He further stated that on the occasion of International Women's Day we should ensure that women belonging to our region receive their due rights. He also highlighted the fact that the representation of young women in higher education has increased yet a large proportion of marginalized women remain deprived. Women can get their rights only when they become aware about the provisions that protect them. He gave his best wishes to the department for organizing the national seminar.

Prof. Lata Pande, welcomed all the guests and speakers. In her address she stated that when women get empowered and strengthened, they can boldly face diverse situations in life and can move ahead. This change can lead to the betterment of the society, future generations and the country. She said that our nation will be successful only when its women are independent and strong. She stated that the objective of this seminar was increase awareness among participants on domestic violence. Women need to respect themselves to know their strengths. Women need to understand various forms of abuse and exploitation against them and protest against it. They should also be aware regarding the violence against women around them in the society. It is very important that women be physically and mentally strong. She also highlighted the fact that the Department of Home Science, DSB Campus, Kumaun University Nainital was devoted to the cause of women and was tirelessly pursuing their vital issues related to their lives.

Dr Chhavi Arya thanked Prof Lata Pande addressing the participants with her encouraging speech. She then invited Prof Indu Pathak to address the Participants and say a few words.

Prof. Indu Pathak thanked the organizing committee for giving her the opportunity to meet and address such a vast gathering of women associated with different organizations, Home Science Department and coming from rural backgrounds. Women, had come from remote rural areas to attend the seminar. She welcome all the distinguished guests and participants on behalf of Faculty of Arts and congratulated



everyone on the occasion of International Women's Day. She stated that this Seminar provided an opportunity for significant and constructive thinking and to develop an understanding on the issue of Domestic Violence. ## Conclusion-

Domestic violence is violation of Human Rights. During the seminar most experts and participants agreed that for the greater good of the society, both genders will have to work together. The seminar also offered an opportunity to discuss the problems faced by women. It was concluded that the day women are able to take their own decision, they will be freed. Women need to be reminded of the constitutional and legal provisions which are in place for their safety and redressal of their grievances and to provide them justice. However, women on the other hand need to be brave and raise their voices against the exploitation. A is a NO is a NO. Women go out to earn a living to different work places where they might where they might be abused, might face violence or face sexual harassment. Here it is very important that women be aware of their rights. She stated that schools should impart sex education which is also mandatory feature of the education policy.

Children should be taught about good touch and bad touch from a very young age. Parents should tell their children that they are willing to help them and stand for them and they should immediately report any such incidence to them. On many instances women are unaware as to how to protect themselves. One of the measures is to

flam

establish an Internal Complaint Committee of the institution/organization. She recommended that every institute should form an ICC (Internal Complaint Committee) with the name and contact number of the panel member displayed on the notice board. The ICC must take action against the perpetrator within 7 days from when the complaint reaches the committee.

The situation of women in the rural Indian society is still far from improved. Biasness often starts from home and we need to remove all stereotypes and prejudices from the family first in order to gain equivalence in society. Though there are many types of violence women are mostly affected by gender based violence and domestic violence. There is the need to organize awareness generation seminars and workshops more frequently. Media can play an important role in creating awareness on domestic violence. Women need to come forward and get empowered. Most importantly gender discrimination needs to be checked at the family level to bring about a change. It is not enough if only few women progress and get empowered. Efforts should also be made to empower each and every woman. We should recognize our strength and not devalue the role and contribution of a mother or a housewife.


## Participants' Feedback

Department of Home Science, D.S.B. Campus, Kumaun University, Nainital organized a National Seminar on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2022 entitled "Assisting Women in Identifying Abusive Relationships and Awareness Generation among them on Provisions for Protection against Domestic Violence". 


# Age Distribution of the Participants




Among these women, 50.56% were working in various organized and unorganized jobs. The remaining 31.56% and 17.97% women were housewives and students respectively.


■ 18-25 years



Data revealed that 67.41% women stated that this was their first seminar on such topic and the remaining 32.58% had attended such seminar before.








Attended first seminar on the topic = Have attended such seminar on the same topic

Participant Feedback Regarding Information given in the Seminar




" Very Informative " Moderately Informative " Less Informative




## Participants' Evaluation of the Seminar

- Such seminars can be organized in rural areas, making it convenient for rural people to attend.





The department of Home Science, D.S.B. Campus, Kumaun University, Nainital organized a one-day National Seminar on "Assisting Women in Identifying Abusive Relationships and Awareness Generation among them on Provisions for Protection against Domestic Violence" on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2022 (Tuesday) at Conference Hall, Rajya Atithi Grah, Mallital, Nainital, Uttarakhand (Nainital Club). The seminar was sponsored by National Commission for Women, Government of India, New Delhi. More than two hundred participants attended the seminar physically. Women should have participation in decision making. He further stated that on the occasion of International Women's Day we should ensure that women belonging to our region receive their due rights. He also highlighted the fact that the representation of young women in higher education has increased yet a large proportion of marginalized women remain deprived. Women can get their rights only when they become aware about the provisions that protect them. He gave his best wishes to the department for organizing the national seminar.

Prof. Lata Pande, welcomed all the guests and speakers. In her address she stated that when women get empowered and strengthened, they can boldly face diverse situations in life and can move ahead. This change can lead to the betterment of the society, future generations and the country. She said that our nation will be successful only when its women are independent and strong. She stated that the objective of this seminar was increase awareness among participants on domestic violence. Women need to respect themselves to know their strengths. Women need to understand various forms of abuse and exploitation against them and protest against it. They should also be aware regarding the violence against women around them in the society. It is very important that women be physically and mentally strong. She also highlighted the fact that the Department of Home Science, DSB Campus, Kumaun University Nainital was devoted to the cause of women and was tirelessly pursuing their vital issues related to their lives.

Dr Chhavi Arya thanked Prof Lata Pande addressing the participants with her encouraging speech. She then invited Prof Indu Pathak to address the Participants and say a few words.

Prof. Indu Pathak thanked the organizing committee for giving her the opportunity to meet and address such a vast gathering of women associated with different organizations, Home Science Department and coming from rural backgrounds. Women, had come from remote rural areas to attend the seminar. She welcome all the distinguished guests and participants on behalf of Faculty of Arts and congratulated

#### Conclusion-

Domestic violence is violation of Human Rights. During the seminar most experts and participants agreed that for the greater good of the society, both genders will have to work together. The seminar also offered an opportunity to discuss the problems faced by women. It was concluded that the day women are able to take their own decision, they will be freed. Women need to be reminded of the constitutional and legal provisions which are in place for their safety and redressal of their grievances and to provide them justice. However, women on the other hand need to be brave and raise their voices against the exploitation. A is a NO is a NO. Women go out to earn a living to different work places where they might where they might be abused, might face violence or face sexual harassment. Here it is very important that women be aware of their rights. She stated that schools should impart sex education which is also mandatory feature of the education policy.

Children should be taught about good touch and bad touch from a very young age. Parents should tell their children that they are willing to help them and stand for them and they should immediately report any such incidence to them. On many instances women are unaware as to how to protect themselves. One of the measures is to

establish an Internal Complaint Committee of the institution/organization. She recommended that every institute should form an ICC (Internal Complaint Committee) with the name and contact number of the panel member displayed on the notice board. The ICC must take action against the perpetrator within 7 days from when the complaint reaches the committee.

The situation of women in the rural Indian society is still far from improved. Biasness often starts from home and we need to remove all stereotypes and prejudices from the family first in order to gain equivalence in society. Though there are many types of violence women are mostly affected by gender based violence and domestic violence. There is the need to organize awareness generation seminars and workshops more frequently. Media can play an important role in creating awareness on domestic violence. Women need to come forward and get empowered. Most importantly gender discrimination needs to be checked at the family level to bring about a change. It is not enough if only few women progress and get empowered. Efforts should also be made to empower each and every woman. We should recognize our strength and not devalue the role and contribution of a mother or a housewife.


#### Participants' Feedback

Department of Home Science, D.S.B. Campus, Kumaun University, Nainital organized a National Seminar on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2022 entitled "Assisting Women in Identifying Abusive Relationships and Awareness Generation among them on Provisions for Protection against Domestic Violence". The seminar was sponsored by National Commission for Women. The analysis of the data collected from their feedback received from participating women revealed the following results.

Women participants were broadly categorized into four age groups, in which 21.3% women were aged between 18-25 years, 26.96% women were between 26-35 years, 25.84% women were between 36-45 years and remaining 26.96% were between 40-60 years.




# Age Distribution of the Participants




Among these women, 50.56% were working in various organized and unorganized jobs. The remaining 31.56% and 17.97% women were housewives and students respectively.


■ 18-25 years



Data revealed that 67.41% women stated that this was their first seminar on such topic and the remaining 32.58% had attended such seminar before.








Attended first seminar on the topic = Have attended such seminar on the same topic

Participant Feedback Regarding Information given in the Seminar




" Very Informative " Moderately Informative " Less Informative




# Participants' Evaluation of the Seminar

- Such seminars can be organized in rural areas, making it convenient for rural people to attend.




